
In the context of the doctoral programme in Applied Linguistics:

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Main value added from a theoretical and methodological perspective:

Writing is a skill that can be *learned*. You will be given theoretical input on structural, rhetorical and linguistic features of academic texts.

Main value added from a practical perspective:

Writing is a skill that must be *practiced*. Most of the retreat will be spent putting pen to paper, applying writing techniques guided by writing prompts. Individual feedback and coaching will help improve your product.

Learning objectives:

- Knowledge: You will recognize and use structural, rhetorical and linguistic features of academic texts.
- Skills, practices: You will produce and edit drafts of your own academic writing.
- Researcher attitudes: You will be able to navigate the challenges that come with writing projects (e.g., writer's block, text reduction)

Evaluation: The writing you produce in this retreat will *not* be evaluated in a pass/fail manner.

Profile

Dr. Eva Kuske is a research associate at the Zurich University of Applied Sciences and manages the Doctoral Programme in Applied Linguistics *Managing Languages, Arguments and Narratives in the Datafied Society.* Since completing her MA and PhD in English languages and literature, she has continuously worked in university management, and she has been teaching courses on academic English writing for Bachelor and PhD students at the University of Bern and at the University of Applied Sciences in Winterthur.
