What exchange options do I have?

Programmes

Swiss-European Mobility Programme (SEMP)

This is the Swiss programme for Erasmus+ on a tertiary level. The ZHAW LSFM has around 80 SEMP partner universities and if you are enrolled at one of them, you are going to receive financial support for your exchange with us. The amount of the so-called SEMP grant depends on the type of mobility (see table below), the country of the home institution and the duration of stay.

Bilateral exchange

We have bilateral agreements with some institutions outside of Europe. If this applies to your home university, you can complete an exchange at the ZHAW LSFM without having to pay any tuition fees here.

Free Mover

If the ZHAW does not have any kind of partnership with your home university, there is the option for an exchange as a so-called Free Mover. Admission is decided on an individual basis.

In all three programmes, you will have to register in our online tool called Mobility Online and complete all mandatory steps before, during and after the exchange. You also need to be enrolled at your home university for the whole duration of stay.



Types of student mobility



Attend modules Student Mobility for Studies (SMS)

You attend modules at the ZHAW LSFM during your exchange. At the end of the mobility, you receive a Transcript of Records (ToR) containing all completed modules, respective grades and ECTS points acquired.

Student Mobility for Traineeships (SMT)

Write your thesis

You write your thesis at the ZHAW LSFM during the exchange, which requires a supervisor here. After the mobility, the ECTS points are awarded by the home university.



What next?

Five steps for a successful start

1 Nomination

Contact the International Office at your home university so they can officially nominate you through <u>international.lsfm@zhaw.ch</u> and consider the corresponding deadlines.

2 Registration

Once your nomination has been confirmed, you will receive the registration link for Mobility Online, the online tool the ZHAW uses to process all mobilities.

3 Visa and insurance matters

Should you need a visa, start the application process early, as it may take up to three months. If possible, get your European Health Insurance Card from your health insurance at home or check whether your cover is equivalent to Switzerland's.

4 Accommodation

Because accommodation options are limited, we recommend starting your search as soon as possible – please always keep an eye out for fraudulent adverts.

5 Module selection and Learning Agreement

Browse through the ZHAW LSFM's → wide range of modules and choose the ones that best fit your study plan.

Cost of living

We are not going to sugarcoat it: Switzerland is expensive. That said, you can expect a very high standard of living and an excellent quality of life. To give you an idea of possible costs, we have compiled a helpful overview, however, please note that **the amounts may vary significantly** depending on your personal way of living.

Matter of expense	Monthly costs in CHF
Accommodation & utilities	500 - 1,000
Sustenance (food, drink, etc.)	100 – 350
Public transport	50 – 200
Leisure time activities and excursions	200 - 500
Fees for registration/residence permit	55 – 200
Swiss health insurance (if applicable)	80 - 100
Total	900 - 1,930

There may be additional one-off costs, such as fees for the visa application process (if applicable) or a rent deposit (usually refunded).
